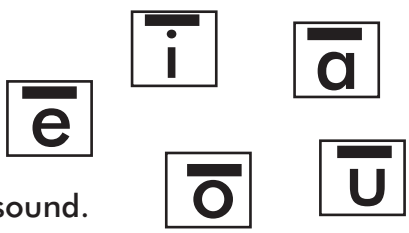

Everybody sings "I Like to Eat" with the vowel sound.



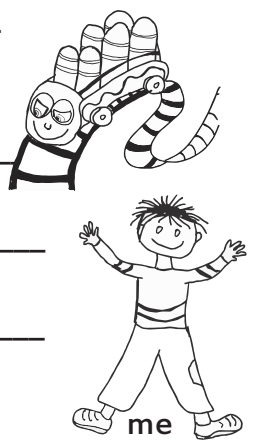
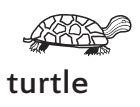
Long vowels say their own name.
